A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE FIH



Field hockey featured at the 1908 and 1920 Olympic Games but was dropped from Paris 1924, largely because the sport lacked an international governing body. In response, the Fédération Internationale de Hockey sur Gazon (FIH) was founded in Paris on 7 January 1924, with seven founding nations: Austria, Belgium, Czechoslovakia, France, Hungary, Spain and Switzerland.

The driving force was Paul Léautey, President of the French Hockey Federation and the FIH's first President. A decorated soldier and businessman, Léautey drafted the original rules and laid the foundations of the global game before his early death in 1926, aged 40. His brother later donated La Coupe Léautey, awarded annually until 1973 to the national association making the greatest contribution to the sport.

The FIH's founding principles were amateurism, sportsmanship and friendship: the beginnings of what is still known today as the "hockey family". By late 1924 the FIH had joined the Union of International Federations, and in 1925 hockey was voted back into the Olympic programme. Membership grew quickly, with India joining in 1928 as the first non-European nation and going on to win eight Olympic gold medals between 1928 and 1980.

Women's hockey followed a separate path. In 1927, English-speaking nations formed the International Federation of Women's Hockey (IFWHA), creating two parallel governing bodies. This division delayed women's inclusion at the Olympics for decades. Following years of negotiation, women's hockey was finally added to the 1980 Moscow Games, and the two federations merged in 1982.

Post-war leadership from Dutchman Quarles van Ufford and Belgian René Frank transformed the sport. Frank, President from 1966, introduced the men's World Cup (1971) and women's World Cup (1974), standardised indoor hockey, modernised the rules, and championed the move to synthetic pitches, first used at the 1976 Montreal Olympics.

The FIH has continued to evolve, introducing Hockey5s in 2014 and staging the first Hockey5s World Cup in Oman in 2024. From seven founding nations a century ago, the FIH now unites more than 130 member associations across every continent – bound together by the spirit of friendship envisioned at that very first meeting in Paris.

NORTH HARBOUR HOCKEY

North Harbour Hockey has a proud history dating back to 1973 with the formation of the North Shore Women's Hockey Association (NSWHA) and by 1975, hockey was established on grass fields across from our current site in Rosedale Park, Albany.



Hockey grew rapidly through the 1970s and 80s, with NSWHA developing one of the largest junior girls' competitions in New Zealand. In 1983, men's hockey competitions were introduced locally, and by 1987 the organisation evolved into the North Harbour Hockey Association (NHHA).

A significant milestone came in 1988-1989 when the first artificial (sand-based) turf was installed at Rosedale, even hosting an international test match in June 1989 between the New Zealand women's team and Japan. Continued growth led to the development of a major hockey complex at Rosedale Park South in the late 1990s, later expanded to three water-based turfs.

In 2019, NHHA moved to the National Hockey Centre on Bush Road, a state-of-the-art facility with multiple turfs and high-performance amenities. In the last six years we've hosted several domestic and international events including the World Masters in 2024, which showcased Aotearoa to the world.

2019 also saw the start of North Harbour Hockey's sustainability journey, inspired by a call from Kaumātua Tracy Davis to better care for the environment and support community wellbeing. Guided by iwi and its Board, a Sustainability Committee and framework grounded in Te Tiriti o Waitangi were established, focusing on resilience, innovation and long-term impact.

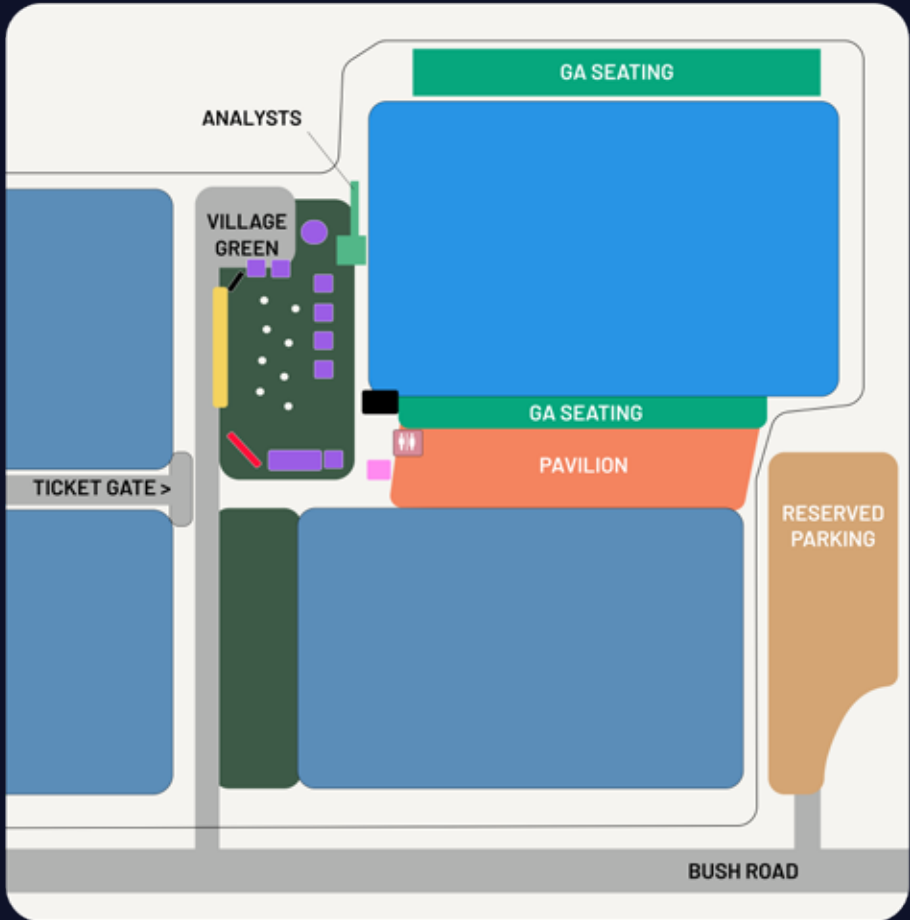
A key initiative is Te Hōnonga a Iwi which brings together iwi, schools, businesses, and the wider community to regenerate land through sustainable and inclusive practices. Supported by Ngāti Whātua o Kaipara, the project has strengthened cultural understanding while delivering environmental, social, and community benefits.

North Harbour Hockey continues to progress its Future Fit Roadmap, working towards Carbon Zero by 2030 through initiatives such as waste reduction, composting, and improved systems, with simple actions like correctly sorting waste helping reduce landfill and lower emissions.

Today, North Harbour Hockey thrives on a strong sense of community, with a legacy of growth, innovation, and connection that makes it one of New Zealand's leading hockey associations.
