ABOUT WAŁCZ

About Wałcz

Wałcz is a picturesque town located in the West Pomeranian Voivodeship of northwestern Poland. Nestled among the serene lakes of Raduń and Zamkowe, the town spans an area of 38.16 km² and, as of 2020, is home to approximately 24,949 residents. Its origins trace back to the late 10th century when it became part of the early Polish state. Granted town rights in 1303, Wałcz flourished as a royal city within the Poznań Voivodeship of Greater Poland.

Today, Wałcz is celebrated for its rich cultural heritage and natural beauty. The town boasts architectural landmarks such as the neo-Renaissance town hall, Gothic Revival churches of St. Nicholas and St. Anthony, and the historic Jesuit College, now one of Poland's oldest high schools. The Museum of the Wałcz Land offers insights into the region's history from prehistoric times through World War II, featuring exhibits on local traditions and the Pomeranian Wall fortifications. For outdoor enthusiasts, Wałcz provides ample opportunities for kayaking, cycling, and hiking, with well-marked trails and recreational facilities around its lakes. The town also hosts an Olympic Training Center, attracting athletes from various disciplines. With its blend of historical significance and natural charm, Wałcz offers a tranquil retreat for visitors seeking both cultural enrichment and outdoor adventure.

ABOUT THE FIH HOCKEY NATIONS CUP 2



The FIH Hockey Nations Cup 2 is a new tournament that involves some of the best hockey playing nations of the world and acts as a pathway to the FIH Hockey Nations Cup and through it, the FIH Hockey Pro League. It introduces a third tier under the FIH Hockey Pro League and the FIH Hockey Nations Cup, with the best performing teams in the Nations Cup 2 gaining promotion to the subsequent edition of the Nations Cup. It also introduces fresh jeopardy to the FIH Hockey Nations Cup, with the teams finishing at the bottom facing relegation into the Nations Cup 2 in the subsequent edition.

The FIH Hockey Nations Cup 2 features the best eight teams (by world rankings) that are not a part of the FIH Hockey Pro League and the FIH Hockey Nations Cup, in both men's and women's competitions. The eight teams are split into two pools of four teams each, with the top two teams in each pool proceeding to the semi-finals, while the bottom two teams from each pool will play for 5-8 place classification.

The FIH Hockey Men's Nations Cup 2 Oman 2025 was played earlier this year from 17-23 February in Muscat, Oman, with Scotland emerging as the inaugural men's champions. The FIH Hockey Women's Nations Cup 2 will now be played from 16-22 June 2025 in Walcz, Poland.

Nickname: Speedy Tigresses

Notable Honours: 1x Bronze Medal - Asian Games (1982), 1x Bronze Medal - Asia Cup (1985), 1x Bronze Medal - Asian Champions Trophy (2013), 8x Gold Medals - South East Asian Games (1997, 1999, 2001, 2007, 2013, 2015, 2017, 2023), 2x Silver Medals - South East Asian Games (1993, 1995)

Current World Ranking: 23

Malaysia come into the inaugural Nations Cup 2 as a young team looking to make their mark. With a squad that includes just four players over the age of 25, Malaysia are a team building for the future, with many of their young players experiencing true international competition for the very first time.

Malaysia have impressed in recent times with their gold medal at the South East Asian Games in 2023, along with impressive wins over Korea and Thailand at the Asian Champions Trophy 2024 in India. They are ranked only below South Africa in Pool A, so carry reasonable expectations to progress into the semi-final, but their task won't be easy against more experienced sides like Uruguay and Poland.

One to Watch: Juliani Din

Captain Juliani Din is the most experienced player in the young Malaysian squad, becoming the first Malaysian player to achieve the 200-appearances milestone last year. Her defensive prowess is always crucial to her side's counter-attacking style, but more so than ever before, the team will rely on her international hockey experience as the young team tries to find its feet against the various styles of play it'll face in this truly international event.

Current World Ranking: 27

As hosts, Poland will have high hopes of making a strong mark on the inaugural edition of the FIH Hockey Women's Nations Cup 2. Their preparation for the event over 2024 provided plenty of positive results as they earned impressive wins over Czechia and Switzerland, while a draw against Italy, the highest ranked team in this competition, during the EuroHockey Championship II also laid down a strong marker for the team.

On paper, Poland are the lowest ranked team in Pool A of the competition, but familiar home conditions will definitely work in their favour, along with local support from the crowd in Walcz. Additionally, Poland will look to draw inspiration from their indoor hockey team's phenomenal performance earlier this year at the FIH Indoor Hockey World Cup Croatia 2025, where they clinched their maiden world championship, with players overlapping across both indoor and outdoor teams, including their inspirational leader Marlena Rybacha.

One to Watch: Marlena Rybacha

Fresh off leading her team to their first ever world championship title in the FIH Indoor Hockey World Cup Croatia 2025, Marlena Rybacha will once again look to inspire her side to achieve over the odds and deliver results in front of their home crowds, this time in the 11-a-side format. With 52 goals in 139 appearances across her career, Rybacha is not just one of the best creators in attack, but also a prolific finisher. Her form in the front line could prove decisive for how far the hosts can go in this competition.

Current World Ranking: 21

South Africa have been the dominant force of African hockey for decades, having claimed seven African continental championships as well as five African Olympic qualification events. However, the team has historically struggled to live up to their potential outside of their continental competitions.

South Africa come to the FIH Hockey Nations Cup 2 off the back of an impressive appearance at the Olympic Games Paris 2024 last year, where their young team took the fight to, and troubled, higher ranked teams like Argentina, Australia, Great Britain and Spain. Now with more experience under their belts, the African side will aim to take a further step up by winning this competition and progressing further towards the FIH Hockey Pro League.

One to Watch: Quanita Bobbs

Quanita Bobbs is South Africa's captain and a hugely influential figure within the team. A four time African continental champion who has competed in multiple World Cup and Commonwealth Games competitions, Bobbs is a key player who will be relied upon to lead her team from the front. It wasn't very long ago when Bobbs was the young player in an experienced South African side, bringing in a new attacking flair to the side. As she leads the next generation of South Africans into the future, the team looks built in her image, with plenty of players like Edith Molikoe and Onthatile Zulu adding more attacking flair; which looks like the new identity of the team.

When their offence is firing, there's scarcely a better team to watch in international hockey than the Cimarronas. Over the past few years, Uruguay have been steadily climbing the international hockey ladder making their way towards the top of the Pan American standings, but now is their time to make their impact felt in a global competition.

All four teams in the Pool A are closely matched in terms of their world rankings, as is the norm in an event such as the FIH Hockey Nations Cup 2. Uruguay will aim to capitalise on their experienced squad to punch high and qualify for the semi-finals. Their forward line led by their most experienced players, Teresa Viana and Manuela Vilar, will be crucial in propelling them over any opponent if they hit their attacking stride.

One to Watch: Manuela Vilar

Manuela Vilar is the most experienced player in the Uruguay squad, while also being the captain and the highest scorer for the team. Her partnership with the other prolific forward in the side, Teresa Viana, is the backbone of the Uruguayan side, with the two combining for 152 caps and 144 goals! The two forwards have previously thrilled fans at the FIH Hockey5s World Cup in 2023, and the FIH Hockey Nations Cup 2 will be the perfect time for them to showcase their prowess in the traditional format of the game as well.

Current World Ranking: 26

Czechia are a team on the rise in Europe and put a marker down at the EuroHockey Championship II in 2023 at home, where they missed out on the gold medal by a whisker against France, who they will face once again in the pool stages of this competition. The second placed finish in 2023 matched their best ever finish in the competition and the FIH Hockey Nations Cup 2 will provide them the perfect opportunity to build on the momentum and take a further step forward in international hockey.

Like Poland, Czechia will aim to draw inspiration from their indoor team's performance at the FIH Indoor Hockey World Cup Croatia 2025, where they bagged the bronze medal, beating the pre-event favourites, Germany, in the bronze medal match. Their team at the Nations Cup 2 will also have players who were a part of that bronze medal winning team in Croatia, including captain Kateřina Laciná.

One to Watch: Kateřina Laciná

Kateřina Laciná stands out as a pivotal figure in the Czechia squad for the upcoming FIH Hockey Women's Nations Cup 2 in Poland. With over 115 international caps and serving as captain, her extensive experience and leadership are invaluable assets to the team. Laciná's versatility is evident from her successful stints in both outdoor and indoor hockey; notably, helping her side secure three bronze medals at the FIH Indoor World Cups in 2015, 2023, and 2025.. As a midfielder, Laciná's ability to control the game's tempo and her strategic vision make her a player to watch, potentially steering Czechia towards a strong performance in the tournament.

France

Current World Ranking: 19

The French women's team made steady progress ahead of their Olympic debut at home during Paris 2024, and while they struggled to compete against their higher ranked opponents, they still came away from the Olympic cycle having improved massively as a team.

As recently as 2019 the team found themselves in the third tier of European competition, but two promotions in the last in the last three events means that next time around they will feature in the elite EuroHockey Championship, their first appearance since 2005. France were utterly dominant at the EuroHockey Championship II 2023 event in Prague, beating Lithuania, Wales, Austria, Ukraine and host nation Czechia to return to Europe's top table. With Czechia and Wales both in Pool B at the Nations Cup 2, France will back themselves to come away from the group into the semi-finals where they can then aim to take the step up towards the FIH Hockey Pro League.

One to Watch: Emma Ponthieu

Emma Ponthieu serves as a cornerstone of the French women's team. With over 89 international caps and a tenure as captain since 2018, Ponthieu brings a wealth of experience and leadership to the squad. Her midfield prowess, contributing in both attack and defence, has been instrumental in France's recent successes, including a gold medal at the 2019 EuroHockey Championship III and a silver at the 2021 EuroHockey Championship II. Ponthieu's journey, marked by her participation in the 2024 Paris Olympics, underscores her commitment and resilience. As the team sets its sights on a strong performance in the Nations Cup, Ponthieu's leadership and on-field acumen will be pivotal in navigating the challenges ahead.

Nickname: Team Azzurre

Notable Honours: 1x Gold Medal - EuroHockey Championship II (2013), 3x Silver Medal - EuroHockey Championship II (2005, 2009, 2019), 1x Bronze Medal - EuroHockey Championship II (2017)

Current World Ranking: 17

Italy are a team on the rise in the European circuit with a young team on a clear long term plan to catch up to their continental rivals. Italy, with their young squad, produced fantastic results at the EuroHockey Championships in 2023. Two draws against higher ranked Ireland and Scotland in the classification stage of the championship put them in the spotlight and helped them qualify for the FIH Hockey Olympic Qualifiers in Ranchi, India.

Italy continued their impressive run at the Olympic qualifiers with a sixth-placed finish, giving higher ranked New Zealand and USA a run for their money and defeating Chile in the qualification matches. And while they didn't manage to qualify for the Olympics, their steady rise in international hockey continues to impress. If Italy can maintain the upward trajectory they have been on, over the past two years, they have the ability to gain promotion towards the FIH Hockey Pro League, with a young squad willing to outwork everyone else.

One to Watch: Federica Carta

Federica Carta, 24, is amongst the youngest players in the Italian squad while also bearing the responsibility of captaining the side. A multi-dimensional forward, Carta is known for her ability to carry the goalscoring burden for an Italian side best known for their sturdy defence. With 30 goals already in just 69 senior caps, Carta is a force to reckon with, who is only going to improve with time!

Current World Ranking: 25

Wales have steadily risen through the ranks of European hockey in recent years, earning respect for their grit, discipline, and tactical clarity. While they have yet to claim a major continental title, their consistent performances at the EuroHockey Championships and Commonwealth Games have established them as a formidable presence. Despite being one of the smaller hockey nations in terms of resources, Wales have routinely punched above their weight on the international stage.

Wales arrive at the FIH Hockey Women's Nations Cup 2 following a solid showing at the EuroHockey Championships II where they finished third behind France and Czechia. Their squad, built around a strong core of experienced players and emerging talent, has demonstrated the ability to compete with and frustrate higher-ranked opposition. With a cohesive unit and a clear game plan, the Welsh side will be eager to make their mark in this tournament and take a decisive step towards the coveted promotion to the FIH Hockey Pro League.

One to Watch: Sarah Jones

Sarah Jones stands as a linchpin in the Welsh team, bringing a wealth of experience and leadership to the squad. With over 115 caps for Wales along with 73 caps for Great Britain, including the Paris 2024 Olympics, Jones has been instrumental in the team's development and achievements. Her international career is highlighted by participation in multiple Commonwealth Games and six EuroHockey Championships, as well as a Bronze medal at the Tokyo 2020 Olympics with GB, showcasing her consistent performance at the highest levels of competition. With a relatively young team, Jones' experience will be extremely valuable to Wales progress in the event.
