About Santiago, and Centro de Entrenamiento del Hockey Césped

Santiago



Santiago is the capital city of Chile and largest in the country. It is well-known for its cultural landscape; museums, gastronomy, vineyards, urban promenades, and the Sky Costanera, the tallest viewpoint in South America.

Santiago is surrounded by hills and framed by the Andes Mountain range, which reaches as high as 5,424m with Cerro El Plomo. One of the main hills in the city is Cerro San Cristobal. One can reach this point by hiking, or by a funicular, and take a glimpse of the stunning views of the city.

The Parque Metropolitano, the city's urban park, is the fourth largest in the world and is a major tourist attraction. Santiago has diverse neighbourhoods, the city's architectural fabric is a rich tapestry of its history. Barrio Italia, for instance, features a mix of old semi-rural buildings.

The city's gastronomy scene incorporates Chilean culinary traditions with influences from neighbouring and even distant countries. Santiago also has a vast network of bike lanes, offering bike rentals for safe, ecological transportation through its historic neighbourhoods and landmarks, such as Lastarria, Concha y Toro, and Yungay.

































The energetic and cosmopolitan nature of Santiago makes it a wonderful place to explore, giving visitors a chance to visit various cultural spaces, such as museums, the pedestrian malls, and various architectural sites within the city. Hillside parks and green spaces are inviting for meandering and restful picnics during the day, while the active nightlife can be experienced through sidewalk eateries, restaurants, beer halls, and cafes.

Centro de Entrenamiento del Hockey Césped | National Stadium Sports Park



The renovated National Stadium Sports Park—Santiago's epicenter of sport andrecreation—now stands as the largest high-performance sports complex in the Americas. Located in the heart of the Nuñoa commune, it also serves as one of the city's great new "green lungs," offering over 10 hectares of open recreational pathways and parkland for families. Spanning more than 64 hectares, the park's high-performance zone encompasses 31 hectares of upgraded facilities, including interior bike lanes, soccer fields, rugby pitches, multi-purpose courts, and field hockey turfs. Pedestrian promenades, extensive landscaping, and new tree plantings enhance the visitor experience, while forthcoming state-of-the-art training centers and renovated venues will further support athlete development. This ambitious transformation represents an investment exceeding 19 billion Chilean pesos.

Qualification overview

Qualification Criteria

Age limit

All players shall be under 21 years of age as of 31 December 2024 that is all players shall be born on or after 1 January 2004.

Teams

The FIH Hockey Women's Junior World Cup 2025 will consist of 24 teams.

1.1. To qualify for the FIH Hockey Women's Junior World Cup 2025, National Associations must compete in their respective Continental Federation (CF) Junior Championships/Qualifier.

1.2. The Host Nation - Chile

1 quota place: The host nation.

1.3. Teams Qualified by Continental Federation – 15 quota places

The Continental quotas are as follows:

- Africa (3): The Top 3 teams in the Junior Africa Cup 2024
- Asia (3): The Top 3 teams in the Junior Asia Cup 2024
- Europe (3): The Top 3 teams in the EuroHockey U21 Championship 2024
- Pan America (3): The Top 3 team in the Junior Pan American Cup 2024
- Oceania (3): The Top 3 teams in the Junior Oceania Cup 2024

Note: when considering the Top 3 nations in each CF Championship, the JWC host nation is not included. Therefore, the continent of the host nation will have the Top 3 teams plus the host nation qualified.

1.4. The remaining 8 Teams will qualify via continental quotas using the FIH Hockey Women's Junior World Ranking on (April 10th, 2024) provided that:

- They are not yet qualified under 1.2 and 1.3 above;
- The Continental quotas are calculated by considering the CF of each nation in the Junior World Rankings, and disregarding the top 3 nations from each CF. The CFs of the top 8 ranked nations that remain in the rankings then earn a continental quota for their CF. These 8 continental quotas are then filled by the highest finishing nations in each continental championship who have not already qualified for the FIH Hockey Women's Junior World Cup 2025.































2.1 Reallocation of Unused Quota Places under 1.3

If an allocated quota place is not confirmed by a Team qualified via the Continental Championship on the deadline established by FIH or is declined by the National Association, the quota place will be reallocated to the next highest placed team in that continental championship.

If the relevant quota remains unfilled, the quota place will be reallocated to the next highest placed team in the Junior World Ranking not yet qualified under 1.2, 1.3 and 1.4.

2.2 Reallocation of Unused Quota Places under 1.4

If an allocated quota place is not confirmed by a Team qualified via the Junior World Ranking guota on the deadline established by FIH or is declined by the National Association, the quota place will be reallocated to the Continent of the next highest placed team in the Junior World Ranking not yet qualified under 1.2, 1.3 and 1.4.



FIH Junior World Rankings

The Junior World Ranking was introduced in June 2023 with the aim of better reflecting the results of this age group (Under 21). The new Ranking model is a Tournament based system and will be constantly impacted by the performance of each new generation of athletes. It can therefore be used as a tool to evaluate the development of hockey in each Nation.

The calculation of the ranking points and the weightings attributed to each competition is similar to what was previously applied for the Senior Outdoor Ranking system and takes into consideration the results of the last three (3) FIH Hockey Junior World Cups and the last three (3) Continental Junior Events.
